### **Call for Artists**

The Katzie First Nation is excited to announce an incredible opportunity for our talented Katzie artists to showcase their creativity and cultural heritage. As part of the upcoming Pattullo Bridge Replacement Project on our territory, we are calling for Katzie artists to come forward and contribute their unique artistic visions. This project aims to celebrate and honour our rich traditions and vibrant community.

### **Pattullo Bridge Replacement Project Summary**

The Pattullo Bridge is a key connection between the communities of Surrey and New Westminister. The new four-lane toll-free bridge will provide important improvements for everyone using the bridge, including people who are driving, cycling or walking, as well as communities on either side of the bridge.



## Art Opportunities

The Project has identified opportunities for art selected by Katzie First Nation to be incorporated into the project in New Westminster and/or Surrey. Katzie First Nation is seeking art designs from artists or artist teams.

The art opportunities available for this call include:

**1. One graphic art design for application on a sound wall:**

Opportunities for incorporating artistic expressions onto aluminum sound wall panels have been identified in New Westminster. The technical narrative, outlining design considerations and specifications for this art feature.

**2. One art design for installation on one (1) of the following three (3) applications\*:**

These art designs are to be two dimensional (2-D) in nature and be a single-color pallet. The art designs are also to be scaled at a 2:1 (horizontal: vertical) scale to allow application at any of the following opportunities. The project Multi-use path railing or overpass railing panel, Retaining wall metal art attachments, OR Urban node concrete etching.

*\* Note: Selected artwork will be considered for one of the three applications. The Project team will review the selected artwork and follow up with the artist to share the application and location the artwork will be applied to.*

**AND Artist Narrative** (150-200 words): Please include the title of the artwork, the date of completion, description of the design and an explanation of how the artwork aligns with the theme.

The general theme for Project artwork is kinship-based trade, transportation, and intergenerational connection.

For the **two opportunities/spots** in this call to artists, artist submissions shall align with the specific themes described in the table below:

### Woven Together

Extending the themes of interconnectedness and intergenerational knowledge and respecting the threads of kinship which have woven the communities working on this project together since time immemorial, the specific theme for both opportunities in this art call is weaving. **The Project team is seeking original designs respecting and promoting traditional weaving patterns.**

**Blankets** - Ancestral mountain goat and wooly dog hair blankets. The Project team understands the communities are rich in history and culture. The Project team has heard that blankets demonstrate not only a material richness but the richness of shared kinship, connecting families and communities across the region, your teachings, and the respect for one another within and across our communities.

**Theme:**

**Basketry** - The Project team understands there were a multitude of basket types based on their use: open work baskets, berry baskets, watertight baskets, storage baskets, cradles, and more. The Project team has heard these were more than storage containers and trade goods, that the patterns on these baskets represented the communities and families who made them and the variety of materials used to create them demonstrate your deep knowledge of the world around you.



### Art Call Process

Artist or artist teams are invited to apply for one of both of the art opportunities described above.

Katzie First Nation artists are eligible for this public art opportunity.

**Artist Budget and License Agreement**

An artist fee to the artist whose art design is selected and submitted to the Project. The artist fee supports the artist in designing the artwork and coordinating with the Project team during the design, fabrication and installation phases.

The artist fee for each art opportunity (**two spots**) is noted below:

1. Sound wall opportunity: **\$5000**
2. Art design opportunities: **\$8000**

The artist fee is full compensation for the artwork, collaboration and communication with the Project team for engineering design, fabrication, installation and communication material, as well as execution of the license agreement.

Shortlisted artists will be provided with honorariums to support the preparation and time of the artists.

A signed License Agreement is requirement for the selected artist please reach out to Roma [roma@katzie.ca](mailto:roma@katzie.ca) for the Licence Agreement.

Artist fees will be paid in one lump sum payment, upon finalization of design and deliverables.

## WHAT IS PROVINCIAL ELECTIONS

The Provincial or Territorial government hold the authority to make decisions which effect the entire province or territory but not for the rest of Canada. We have provincial elections so that the elected leader can make changes for our province as a whole. This entailes things such as health, transportation, labour, child welfare, education, property and civil rights.

## WHY IS IT IMPORTANT TO VOTE

Every election affects each person whether its Provincial or Federal. Its important to vote because the person elected is making decisions that effects us all. Many people seem to think that their vote won't matter but with the more people that start to vote, it could create a different outcome. Change comes from the people and if you feel you want change within our province I would suggest registering to vote.
