OPTIONAL CANDIDATE LITERATURE MAIL OUT

Be advised, should you be considering running in the 2026 election, an OPTIONAL CANDIDATE LITERATURE MAIL OUT is available, but there is a tight time to provide the electoral officer with your materials.

Deadline - February 2, 2026 at noon

The electoral officer will also facilitate an optional mail out if you want to send campaign information to members off reserve. You will have to pay for it at cost (postage, printing, handling and supplies). If you would like to send something out, the following are the details (more details in candidate letter at nomination meeting):

One group mailer will be sent on February 3rd, with any literature candidates sent to me. No mailer goes if no candidates want to send anything.

The maximum you can send is a double-sided letter size page (if you want me to print, I will charge everyone based on what they get printed... colour or b&w, etc...

Estimated mailing costs (postage, envelopes, stuffing, etc..) should be between \$400 and \$600, but is split by whomever participates (ie. costs go down as more people participate). That price above would be based on a double sided page in colour. Single sided or Black & White, it will be a bit cheaper).

The deadline is early as there is very little time in the election process overall.

Keep Your Pets Safe & Warm This Winter

- Please do not tether or chain dogs outside when temperatures drop below 7°C or during severe weather warnings.
- If your dog is kept outside, please ensure it has appropriate shelter and care for cold weather conditions.

Friendly Reminder for Permit Applications

Katzie Lands Department has developed a KFN Member-specific Simplified Permit Application for permit applications for small projects, separate from Large-Scale Development Projects.

Bei Jiang (KFN Planner) will determine whether a permit is required for a proposed activity. If a permit is required, Bei will assist KFN members from start to finish to complete the permit application.

Why apply for a permit?

A permit helps protect members by:

- Confirming property lines so you can clearly understand the location of your existing boundaries and help prevent encroachment onto adjacent member lots and/or KFN-held lands.
- Identifying existing utilities and servicing infrastructure on or near your property (e.g., water, sewer, gas lines, septic systems, and drain fields), which helps prevent damage and potential repair costs to the member if services are impacted.
- Ensuring contractors meet professional standards that support health and safety on Katzie Lands. This helps reduce liability for the KFN member by requiring accountable, qualified, and ethical professional practice.

When do you need a permit?

You will need a permit if you plan to

- Place a C-Can storage container, or a new structure that exceeds 200 square feet.
- Deposit or remove soil/gravel on your property that measures more than 10.0 m³ which is equivalent to half of a dump truck.



Friendly Reminder for Permit Applications

Purpose:

To regulate land developments on Katzie Lands in a way that:

1. Ensures safety, sustainability, and environmental protection.
2. Aligns with Katzie's cultural values and the Katzie Land Use Plan.
3. Ensures contractors are held accountable to sound ethical and professional standards that support safety, health, accessibility, energy efficiency, and structural integrity for land development and building construction for Katzie members on Katzie Lands.

Planning and Design Requirements

1. Development and building design plans must be signed and sealed by a certified, qualified professional.
2. Conceptual and final design plans for servicing and development works (e.g., water, sewer, roads, and buildings).
3. Geotechnical assessment to determine soil stability and bearing capacity, ensuring the ground can safely support proposed buildings and infrastructure.
4. Environmental off-sets to replace or mitigate loss of environmental and/or ecological space, supporting sustainable development and preservation of natural habitat.



Friendly Reminder for Permit Applications

Subdivision, Development & Serving (SDS) Law

Purpose: To regulate land developments on Katzie Lands in a way that:

- Aligns with Katzie's cultural values and the Katzie Land Use Plan.
- Holds contractors accountable for ethical, professional standards that support human health and safety for all developments on all Katzie Lands, helping reduce liability for KFN members.

Soil Removal & Deposit Law

Purpose: To regulate the deposit, removal, and management of soil and fill materials on Katzie lands in a way that:

- Ensures soil and fill activities protect the environment and community health (e.g., clean, uncontaminated soil/gravel)
- Preserves water quality, fish habitat, and culturally significant areas from contamination or degradation.
- Provides clear procedures for obtaining permits and approvals prior to any soil deposit or removal.
- Supports sustainable development and responsible land use on Katzie Lands.

CPKC Rail Logistics Park Vancouver Project

Proposed Rail Yard Expansion on Katzie Slough at Pitt River

Katzie's Territorial Guardianship and Referrals Department is working on a cumulative effects assessment of CPKC's proposed Logistics Park Vancouver (LPV) Project.

About the Logistics Park Vancouver Project

The LPV Project is a proposed expansion to the existing rail yard, south of Katzie Slough where it meets the Pitt River. The expanded yard will be a road to rail facility that stores electric cars, agricultural products like grains etc., and fuels, and transfers these goods from rail to truck.

Why are we doing a Cumulative Effects Assessment?

Katzie has been engaged with CPKC about the Project since 2019. Katzie raised concerns that the Project's impact assessment process did not adequately address impacts, including cumulative effects, on Katzie's rights.

In 2023, the Canadian Transportation Agency ordered CPKC to assess cumulative effects on Katzie rights in the past, present and future. Katzie has taken on the important responsibility of leading the cumulative effects assessment.

The assessment looks at the Pitt Polder's sloughs and wetland area and how it has changed over time, from pre-european contact to present day.

Cumulative Effects Assessment Process

The Cumulative Effects Assessment will evaluate how the LPV Project may contribute to past and ongoing cumulative impacts on the ability of Katzie to meaningfully exercise rights within the Pitt Polder sloughs and wetland area.

The assessment will focus on harvesting, cultural practices, access and movement and governance and guardianship rights within the pitt-polder, how this has changed over time, and how to support the revitalization of these rights and responsibilities into the future.

Cumulative Effects Assessment Process (continued)

We are gathering Katzie information on the Pitt-Polder area from past reports and Katzie work undertaken in the area. We are taking a two-eye seeing approach and also gathering knowledge on western science and settlement throughout the pitt-polder.



Colloborative Committes for the LPV Project

Katzie has entered into a colloborative committee agreement with the Canada Transportation Agency and a communication protocol and relationship committee agreement with CPKC.

Through these agreements we hope to work with decision makers and CPKC to protect and where necessary accommodate for impacts on Katzie's rights resulting from this project, as guided by the findings of our cumulative effects assessment.

Next Steps

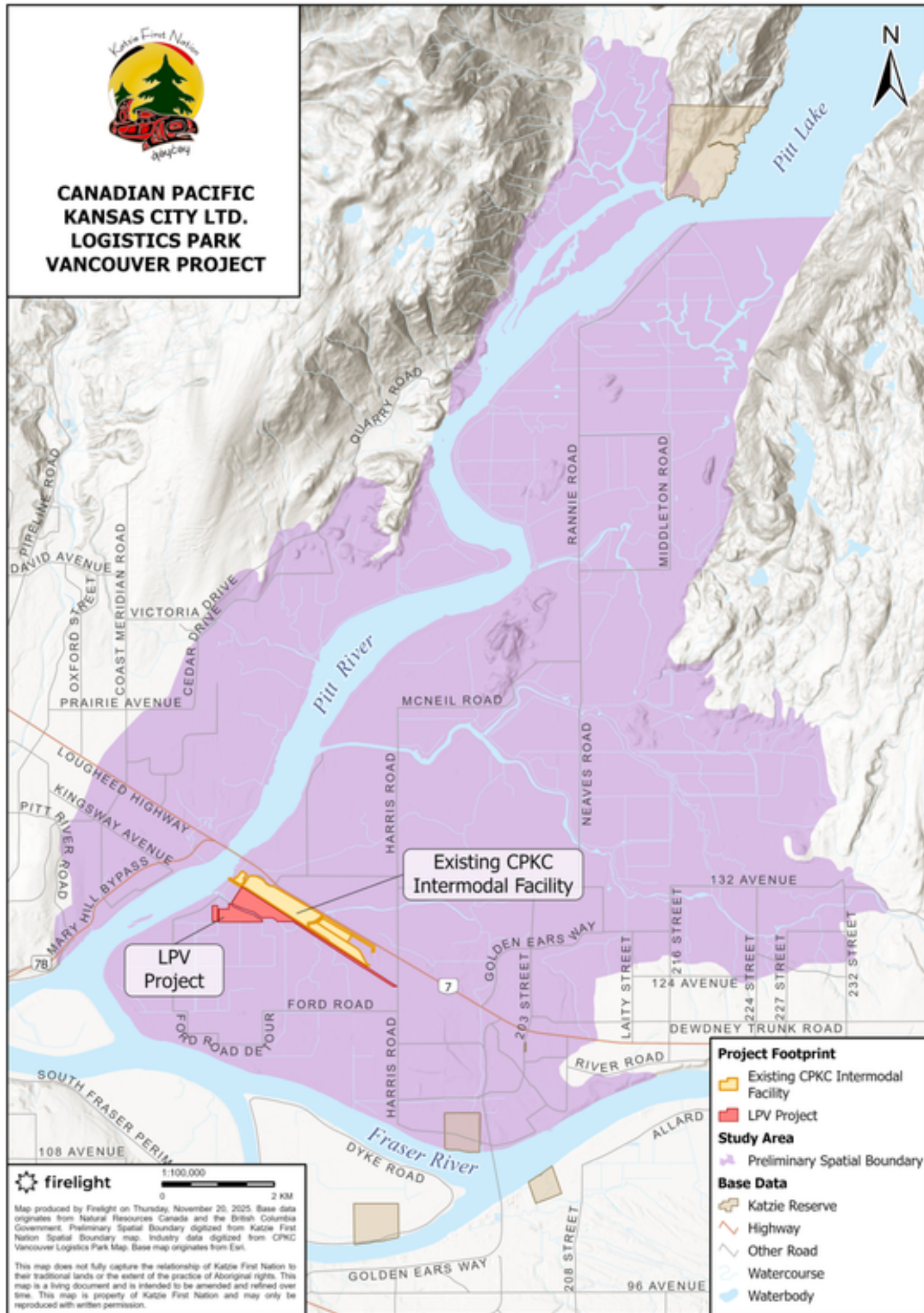
We are mapping out the information we have, and identifying information gaps we need to fill. We will be working to address these gaps near the end of February, and will work with Katzie people and contracted professionals to do this.

In spring of 2026 we will share the draft findings of our assessment with community, including recommendations to avoid or address impacts on Katzie's rights from the LPV Project.

RE: Finance and Audit Committee Call Out Letter

Having enacted its Financial Administration Law under the authority of the *Fiscal Management Act*, Katzie First Nation is looking for experienced community members and non-members to join its Finance and Audit Committee. The Finance and Audit Committee is a team of people that Council appoints to give them financial advice. The committee provides forward-thinking oversight of financial administration matters of the Nation and supports Council in making good financial decisions for the long term.

The Finance and Audit Committee shall be comprised of two community members and one Council member.

The appointment would be for a 3-year term, and the committee member would be expected to commit to preparing for and attending a minimum of 4 committee meetings per year and on-line meeting can be arranged and agreed. Minutes of meeting should be prepared, produced & distributed after each meeting. Members must be independent of the Nation (not involved in day-to-day operations or day-to-day financial decisions), must declare any conflict of interest according to policy and are not currently sitting on other committees.

To be eligible to sit on the Finance and Audit Committee, you should have financial competency (skill and knowledge to make sound financial decisions), be in good financial standing with the Nation, must not have been removed from a board, committee, or other body for breach of confidentiality within the last five years and know how to demonstrate fairness and integrity.

Preferred qualifications:

- Formal accounting and/or business education, or relevant experience
- Ability to read and understand financial statements, plus a minimum of 7 years of business experience or an equivalent combination of education and experience

Experience in one or more of the following areas would be an asset.

- Risk Management
- Business Analytics/Management Information Systems
- Organizational Sustainability
- First Nations Administration
- Economic Development

The role of the Finance and Committee:

- Review and recommend certain items to Council but Council is responsible for making decision.
- Items for recommendation include draft annual budgets, multi-year financial planning, the financial performance of Katzie First Nation, as well as quarterly and annual financial statements.
