Katzie Slough Survey for the Cumulative Effects Assessment Tell Us What You Think!

Background

Canadian Pacific KansasCity Rail (CPKC) is proposing to expand their existing Rail Yard at the mouth of Katzie Slough on the Pitt River to extend south of tracks. This expansion will be a train to truck facility to transfer fuel, agricultural products, and cars and increase train and road traffic throughout the area.

Katzie is assessing the impacts of this project on Katzie's rights and title, with a focus on harvesting, governance, and territorial access rights. We are particularly concerned about project impacts to Katzie Slough and the connected slough network within the Pitt Polder. As part of our assessment we are working to identify how Katzie Slough and the slough network has changed over time from pre-European contact to present day and set a vision for the slough network for future generations. To do this, we need your help and feedback!

By looking beyond the present to the past and future, Katzie aims to shine a spotlight on our slough network and its cultural importance to Katzie people.



What changes have you seen in Katzie Slough?

- Changes to fish, fish habitat, and fishing in the sloughs?
- Changes to wildlife and bird habitat as well as hunting and trapping in the sloughs?
- What can be done in the short term to make Katzie Slough healthier?
- If you dream big, what would you like for Katzie Slough in the future?

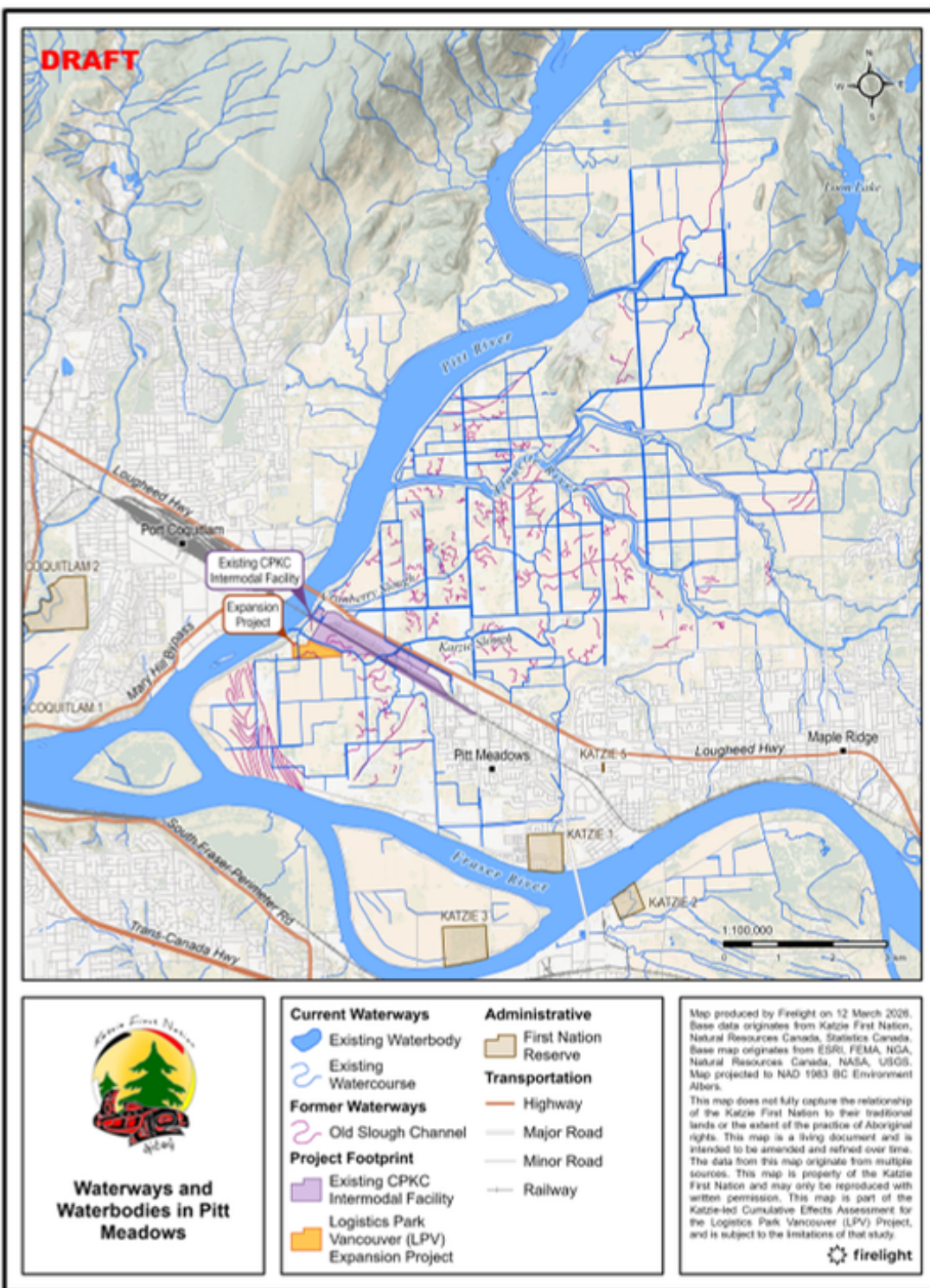

COMMUNITY SAFETY & REPORTING GUIDELINES

Reporting Federal Offenses

If you are a witness or victim of a federal offence or suspicious activity, report directly to the RCMP.

Examples: Theft, Assault, Sexual Assault, damage to property, drug trafficking.

Step 1:

Call RCMP detachment in your area;

- IR 1 Ridge Meadows Detachment RCMP: 604-463-6251
- IR 2 & 3-Langley RCMP: 694-532-3200

****Note: If you are in immediate danger or fear for your safety, call 911.***

Step 2:

- Provide details such as name, date, location (with address) of the crime, vehicle description, and, if possible, photos or videos.
- Be sure to request the File number of your report.

Reporting Offenses against Katzie Laws

For violations specific to KFN Laws, please contact the KFN Land Steward.

Examples: Banished persons on reserve land, Unauthorized dumping, Trespass.

Important: KFN Chief & Council or KFN Land Steward do not have the power and authority to enforce federal offenses

2025-2026 Member Wills & Estates Update

Dear Katzie Members,

- Please be advised that the Funding Support the Lands Department receives for KFN Member Wills and Estates planning is for a total of 20 Katzie members per year.
- Unfortunately, we have filled each of the 20 spots for this year, please note we will add members to the waiting list for next years Wills and Estates planning.

Please note the criteria set by Indigenous Services Canada (ISC) for selection of members wishing to draft their Wills is;

- Member is an Elder and/or a Member who lives on reserve and currently holds a Certificate of Possession (Land Allotment).
- Member is and Elder and/or Member currently is in a rent-to-own agreement with Katzie First Nation more than ½ way and/or nearing the conclusion of their rent-to-own agreement with KFN which will entitle the Member to a Certificate of Possession.
- Elder or Member who lives off reserve and who has a Certificate of Possession.
- Member is married with children and either holds a Certificate of Possession or is more than ½ way and/or is near the conclusion of their rent-to-own agreement with KFN.
- Member has been diagnosed with a failing health condition, lives on reserve and holds or will be entitled to hold a Certificate of Possession at the conclusion of their rent-to-own agreement with KFN.

CPKC Rail Logistics Park Vancouver Project

Proposed Rail Yard Expansion on Katzie Slough at Pitt River

Katzie's Territorial Guardianship and Referrals Department is working on a cumulative effects assessment of CPKC's proposed Logistics Park Vancouver (LPV) Project.

About the Logistics Park Vancouver Project

The LPV Project is a proposed expansion to the existing rail yard, south of Katzie Slough where it meets the Pitt River. The expanded yard will be a road to rail facility that stores electric cars, agricultural products like grains etc., and fuels, and transfers these goods from rail to truck.

Why are we doing a Cumulative Effects Assessment?

Katzie has been engaged with CPKC about the Project since 2019. Katzie raised concerns that the Project's impact assessment process did not adequately address impacts, including cumulative effects, on Katzie's rights.

In 2023, the Canadian Transportation Agency ordered CPKC to assess cumulative effects on Katzie rights in the past, present and future. Katzie has taken on the important responsibility of leading the cumulative effects assessment.

The assessment looks at the Pitt Polder's sloughs and wetland area and how it has changed over time, from pre-european contact to present day.

Cumulative Effects Assessment Process

The Cumulative Effects Assessment will evaluate how the LPV Project may contribute to past and ongoing cumulative impacts on the ability of Katzie to meaningfully exercise rights within the Pitt Polder sloughs and wetland area.

The assessment will focus on harvesting, cultural practices, access and movement and governance and guardianship rights within the pitt-polder, how this has changed over time, and how to support the revitalization of these rights and responsibilities into the future.

Cumulative Effects Assessment Process (continued)

We are gathering Katzie information on the Pitt-Polder area from past reports and Katzie work undertaken in the area. We are taking a two-eye seeing approach and also gathering knowledge on western science and settlement throughout the pitt-polder.



Colloborative Committes for the LPV Project

Katzie has entered into a colloborative committee agreement with the Canada Transportation Agency and a communication protocol and relationship committee agreement with CPKC.

Through these agreements we hope to work with decision makers and CPKC to protect and where necessary accommodate for impacts on Katzie's rights resulting from this project, as guided by the findings of our cumulative effects assessment.

Next Steps

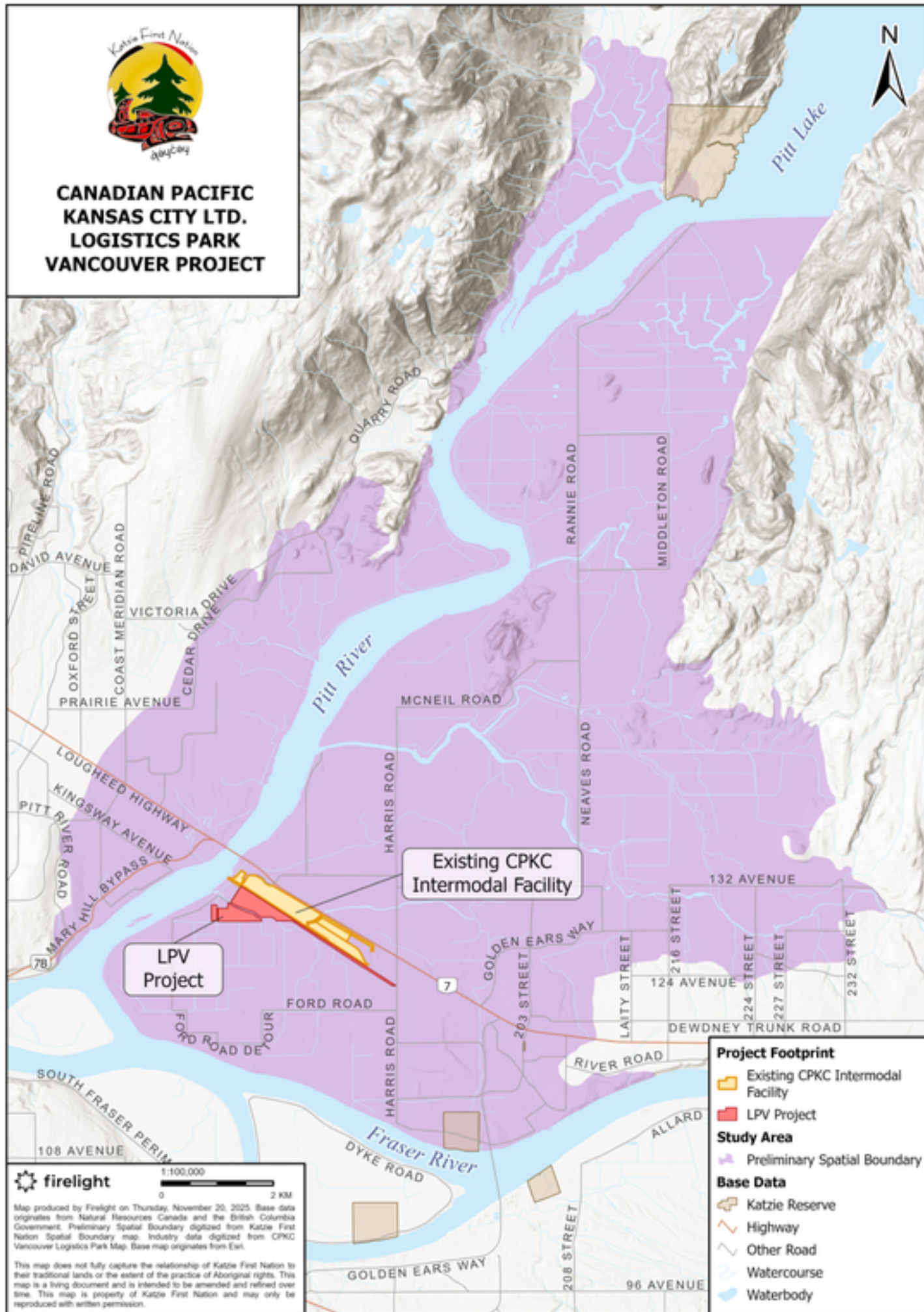
We are mapping out the information we have, and identifying information gaps we need to fill. We will be working to address these gaps near the end of February, and will work with Katzie people and contracted professionals to do this.

In spring of 2026 we will share the draft findings of our assessment with community, including recommendations to avoid or address impacts on Katzie's rights from the LPV Project.

RE: Finance and Audit Committee Call Out Letter

Having enacted its Financial Administration Law under the authority of the *Fiscal Management Act*, Katzie First Nation is looking for experienced community members and non-members to join its Finance and Audit Committee. The Finance and Audit Committee is a team of people that Council appoints to give them financial advice. The committee provides forward-thinking oversight of financial administration matters of the Nation and supports Council in making good financial decisions for the long term.

The Finance and Audit Committee shall be comprised of two community members and one Council member.

The appointment would be for a 3-year term, and the committee member would be expected to commit to preparing for and attending a minimum of 4 committee meetings per year and on-line meeting can be arranged and agreed. Minutes of meeting should be prepared, produced & distributed after each meeting. Members must be independent of the Nation (not involved in day-to-day operations or day-to-day financial decisions), must declare any conflict of interest according to policy and are not currently sitting on other committees.

To be eligible to sit on the Finance and Audit Committee, you should have financial competency (skill and knowledge to make sound financial decisions), be in good financial standing with the Nation, must not have been removed from a board, committee, or other body for breach of confidentiality within the last five years and know how to demonstrate fairness and integrity.

Preferred qualifications:

- Formal accounting and/or business education, or relevant experience
- Ability to read and understand financial statements, plus a minimum of 7 years of business experience or an equivalent combination of education and experience

Experience in one or more of the following areas would be an asset.

- Risk Management
- Business Analytics/Management Information Systems
- Organizational Sustainability
- First Nations Administration
- Economic Development

The role of the Finance and Committee:

- Review and recommend certain items to Council but Council is responsible for making decision.
- Items for recommendation include draft annual budgets, multi-year financial planning, the financial performance of Katzie First Nation, as well as quarterly and annual financial statements.
