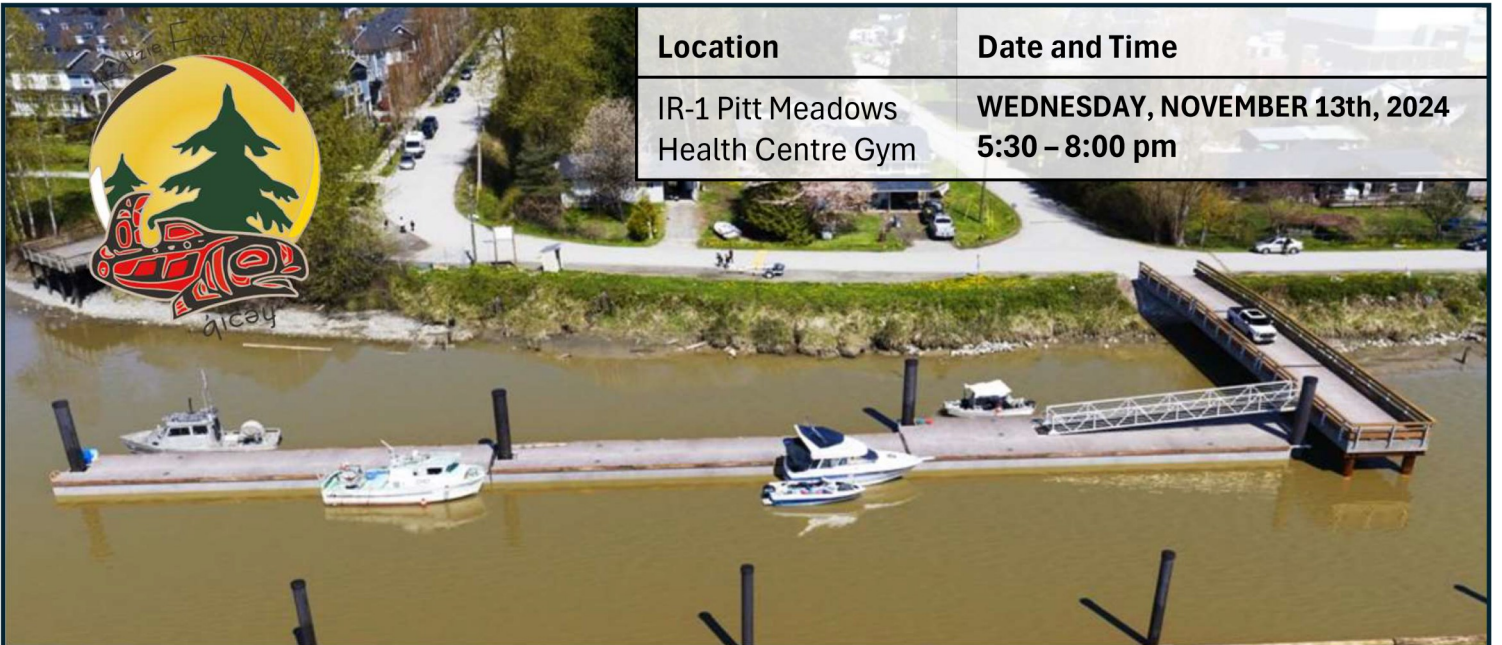

Tips for a Planned Power Outage

- Keep Fridge and Freezer Closed: To maintain the temperature and protect your food, keep the doors shut. Dairy and meat can spoil in your fridge after just 4 hours without power.
- Use Frozen Water Jugs: Place frozen jugs of water in your fridge to help keep it cool longer.
- Avoid Grocery Shopping: Don't stock up on groceries right before the outage; it's best to minimize food waste.
- Unplug Non-Essential Appliances: When power is restored, there may be surges that could damage your appliances. Unplug items like lamps, coffee makers, and chargers.
- Turn Off Light Switches: Switch off all light switches the night before to prevent flickering when power returns.
- Have Snacks and Water Ready: Make sure to have non-perishable snacks and water on hand that don't require refrigeration.
- Visit the Katzie Health Centre: Members can come by for coffee, tea, water, and food during the outage.
- By following these steps, you can better prepare for a planned power outage and protect your food and appliances.

UPCOMING COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT SESSION

The Infrastructure Team warmly invites you to a Community Engagement Session on **November 13th at 5:30 PM** to talk about the new Wharf construction and its impact. This Community Engagement session will cover:

- **Construction Schedule:** Starting at the **beginning of January 2025** and targeted to finish at the **end of March 2025**.
- **Boat Information:** We will collect information about boats, including if the boats need to be used or stored at the Marina during construction (ie accessibility and mooring).
- **Derelict Boats:** We will gather information on abandoned boats in the marina.
- **Pile Installation:** We will identify where a vibration hammer will briefly be used during construction and explain how we will inspect and monitor nearby homes.
- **Next Community Engagement and Communication:** In early January we will have another Community Engagement Session to re-review the project schedule and any potential impacts (traffic, etc.) Updates will also be provided in future newsletters and posted at the existing Marina.

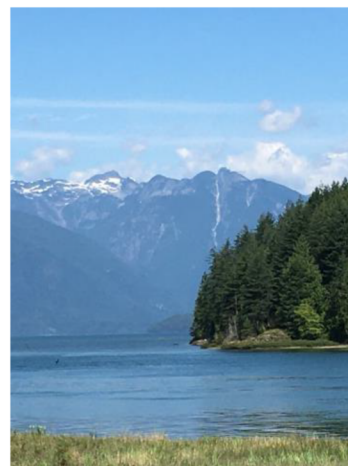

English 394J: Interdisciplinary Studies in English Literature

Cultural Studies 499: Community-Engaged Research in Cultural Studies



Students learn the Salish community's land-based stories as they relate to the nation's land/Land/tmix^w/teməx^w and as they relate to ecosystem restoration projects. Students gain an opportunity to transform their consciences and communication skills through experiential learning and through new ways of reading/listening to Salish Elders, Knowledge Keepers, Protectors and Scholars. Students learn through **on-line**



classes and through two 4-day on the Land internships in two local Salishan communities: **one Interior Salish** (accommodation tba) and **one Coast Salish** (accommodation at Loon Lake Lodge in **Katzie Territory**). Travel and accommodation will be covered through an Indigenous Strategic Initiatives (ISI) Stream 1 Innovation grant.

Pre-requisites: 3 or 4-year standing and previous experience in Indigenous Studies, language and/or literatures, and/or Indigenous community land-based work.

Application to this unique course is through email application to me (kerrie.charnley@ubc.ca) stating your background education and experience regarding the above pre-requisites, and an interview. The course will be filled based on the application, the interview and is on a first come first serve basis. **Limit is 12 students.**

* **Three seats are saved for community members of the two Salish nations where the course is.**

Land Code & Law Review

MEMBER ENGAGEMENT

What is the Katzie Land Code, and how does it benefit Katzie First Nation?

Approved in 2017, the Katzie Land Code replaces 44 sections of the *Indian Act*. The Katzie Land Code enables KFN to resume authority to govern their lands and create laws. Since 2017, Katzie has developed and implemented Katzie Laws to mitigate negative impacts due to past poor management of Katzie Lands under the *Indian Act*.

Why are we encouraging discussion about the Land Code?

Katzie's Chief and Council hope to share information and seek member input regarding the purpose of the Katzie Land Code and Laws to encourage meaningful discussion on what members believe is working well and what is not and to discuss possible solutions.
