The KFN Membership Department is currently recruiting Katzie Members to join a new Membership Committee. This Membership Committee is established under the authority of Katzie Chief and Council in accordance with the Katzie Membership Code.

The KFN Membership Committee shall be composed of the Chief of the Katzie First Nation and five (5) KFN members who are appointed through an application process and determined by a quorum of Katzie Chief and Council. All applicants must be 18 years or older and a registered member of the Katzie First Nation to be considered for a seat on the Membership Committee.

The purpose of the KFN Membership Committee is to:

- a) Examine and recommend acceptance or rejection of applications for membership to the band based on the procedures outlined in the Katzie Membership Code;
- b) Provide input and advice to Council on amendments to the KFN Membership Code;
- c) Provide assistance as required in the coordination of general KFN meetings regarding the Membership Code, membership referendum votes, or related ratification votes; and
- d) Perform other such duties and functions as Council may direct.

If you're interested in applying, please do not hesitate to submit your letter of interest to Rosanna Leon, KFN Indian Registry Administrator at rosannaleon@katzie.ca or drop off at Health Center Reception to the attention of Rosanna Leon in an enclosed envelope. Your letter of interest should be no more than one (1) page in length and should outline your qualifications for sitting on the Membership Committee.

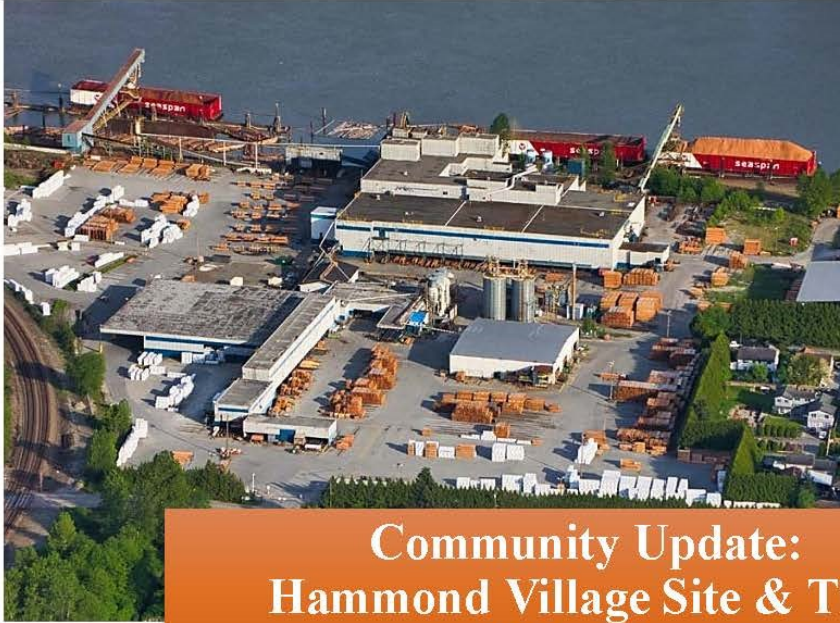

Community Update: Hammond Village Site & Title Litigation

To the Katzie Community,

On August 4, 2021, Katzie First Nation held a referendum on the future of the historic Katzie Village Site located at Hammond Mill. The referendum question posed to the community asked if membership supported the idea of pursuing Aboriginal Title Litigation for the entire Hammond property. The results of the election had 80% of electors voting in favor of pursuing title litigation.

Based on this result, Katzie Chief and Council will be directing the legal firm First People's Law to begin preparing all the related materials needed for Katzie to draft the first legal document in this proceeding, called the Notice of Civil Claim. As part of this process, First Peoples Law will be doing some preliminary strength of claim work to identify good evidence, any gaps in the evidence, as well as a plan to fill them.

As was expressed in past community updates, the Hammond property was sold to a private development company called Conwest on July 21, 2021. As such, there remains a lot of uncertainty surrounding whether Katzie will be able to acquire the property and displace Conwest's interest through Aboriginal Title Litigation.

Katzie is currently operating under the assumption that if the Nation does pursue a title claim for the historic village site at Hammond and wins, the Nation will receive title recognition for the site but not full ownership of the property. The Nation may receive compensation equal to the value of the property and the loss of use the Nation has suffered as a result of the Crown's wrongful

taking of the property in recognition of Katzie's title, but the court would most likely still allow Conwest to retain its fee simple interest in the land. As such, First People's Law will be working with a land appraiser to establish a potential damage estimate, so Katzie knows the potential amount of a damage award.

However, before this important legal work can begin, Katzie will need to determine how it will pay for it. The estimated cost for this work is \$75,000. Currently, the Nation does not have the funds to cover these costs and there are no known external funding sources that Katzie can access. Katzie leadership and staff are working to secure funding to support this important work and are reviewing all available funding options.

Once the funding has been secured and the legal firm has put together all of the initial information (Notice of Civil Claim, preliminary evidence gathering, potential damage estimate, etc.) it will be presented to Katzie Membership at a special community meeting. Based on the information provided, the attending members will be asked to vote on whether the Nation should fully pursue a title claim (the threshold will be a simple majority, 50% plus 1).

As Conwest is the current title holder for the Hammond property, the company will likely continue to prepare the site for development in the near future. Katzie, therefore, will need to decide if the Nation should continue to work with the company during this initial development process, or not. If Katzie chooses not to work with Conwest, it is likely that the company will continue to develop the site based on their priorities – not Katzie's. This could make it difficult for the Nation to acquire any kind of direct benefits from possible development of the site, as Katzie would have a limited role in shaping the development process.

In the near term, Katzie leadership and staff will continue to engage with the company to ensure that Katzie artifacts and ancestral remains are not damaged or disrespected. Additionally, further community engagement will take place to ensure that input from Katzie Membership continues to guide Chief and Council.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

Since 2019, Katzie First Nation, WWF-Canada, the Lower Fraser Fisheries Alliance, the DFO Resource Restoration Unit and other local partners have been working to restore important habitat in the Upper Pitt River Watershed. This project includes opportunities for Katzie members to engage with the restoration work and gain related skills and expertise. As part of this work, Katzie is offering membership the opportunity to participate in a self-directed, online education course on salmon habitat restoration.

Through this course you will learn about current restoration work in the Upper Pitt and salmon habitat restoration throughout the Lower Fraser watershed. This course is ideal for students exploring restoration as a potential career path; technical people already in this field who might want to know more about specific techniques for salmon habitat restoration; and Katzie community members who care about salmon and want to know how restoration helps them thrive.

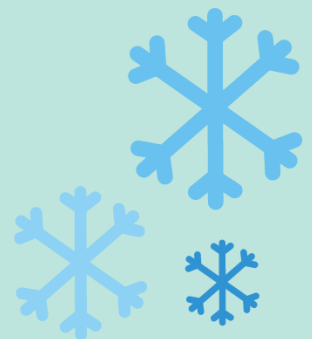

Artist Call/Expression of Interest

Grounding Langley: Sharing the Language of the Land and Water

staiəw Arts and Cultural Society invites community members from the land-based q̓icəy̓ (Katzie), q̓wɑ:ḥəḥ (Kwantlen), Mátheḱwi (Matsqui), and se'mya'me (Semiahmoo) First Nations, to express their interest in producing public artwork as part of the *Grounding Langley: Sharing the Language of the Land and Water* project.

This project, generously funded through the **Community Foundations of Canada Healthy Communities Initiative**, and developed in partnership with q̓wɑ:ḥəḥ (Kwantlen) Lands, Resources and Stewardship and the Langley Centennial Museum, will contribute to community vibrancy and knowledge sharing, exhibiting the ties of the land-based First Nations communities, in an effort to decolonize shared spaces. It takes art and culture outdoors, displaying unique works in public spaces throughout the lands known today as the Township of Langley, encouraging community members and visitors alike to get active outdoors, supporting both mental and physical wellbeing.

We are seeking **10 Indigenous artists** to design public artworks that share community connections to the local lands and water since time immemorial. The themes for each of these unique works will be identified by q̓icəy̓, q̓wɑ:ḥəḥ, Mátheḱwi, and se'mya'me Elders and language keepers. It is our hope that the designs will capture key plants, animals, and landscape features, **5 designs representing the land and 5 designs representing the water**, which will be etched into cedar plaques with their associated ḥəḥq̓emihəm and ḥəḥq̓eməyem names.

Project Deliverables

- 1) **Design:** Based on an object or theme chosen by the Elder and language panel. We will require line drawings in black ink or coloured drawings. Drawings will be submitted either in hard copy or as a digital file (jpeg, tiff, pdf, or vectorized). As is required, the project team will vectorize the file for use in cedar etching and the development of printed paper takeaways (i.e., colouring sheets, bookmarks).
- 2) **Video:** An artist talk that describes your connection to the land and water, your artistic approach and work process for this project. This short video (approximately 2 to 3 minutes) will be filmed in partnership with the project videography team. It will be made publicly available on YouTube.
- 3) **Participation in Project Launch:** Participation is required for the project launch/artwork unveiling in the Spring of 2022.

Project Timeline

Application questions are due **November 15, 2021**.

Application packages are due **November 30, 2021**.

Panel decided objects/themes will be assigned by **December 15, 2021**.

Final designs must be submitted by **January 31, 2022**.

Videos will be recorded in **January 2022**.

Project launch is anticipated for the **Spring of 2022** with wrap up by **June 30, 2022**.

Compensation¹ to each Selected Artist: \$3,000.00²

Application Requirements

We encourage and uplift different approaches to present/submit your application. You may use any preferred format (e.g., written, video, audio, photographs, or a combination of different media) as long as the following information is shared:

- 1) **Your Interest in the Project and Connection to the Lands and Waters:** What excites you most about this opportunity? Are there any considerations, practises, and protocols that will guide this project work?
- 2) **Artist Bio:** Identify and describe your artistic experience/practise and the development/maintenance of your cultural ways of being and knowing.
- 3) **Samples of Your Work:** Showcase and explain your favourite pieces (maximum of 10 different works).
- 4) **Completed Application Form:** With contact information and land-based First Nation community affiliation.

¹ **Not Eligible:** Fees for materials/digitization, subcontractors, travel, accommodation, communication, and other administration costs. Fabrication and installation costs have been budgeted and will be overseen by the core project team.

² Selected artists will be paid in installments. Artists will receive 50% after execution of the contract. The second 50% installment will be paid upon delivery of design and completion of video filming.

As the Youth Program and Artist Apprentice, you will contribute to two main projects.

Youth Council (25% time commitment):

The core of our CTS Youth program is education, including the development and mentorship of youth leadership skills. Under close supervision and mentorship from more senior staff, including the Executive Director, as the Youth Council Mentor you will facilitate, develop, and organize other less experienced young people to grow as leaders in programs including the Youth Council. As the Youth Council Mentor, you will develop new leadership skills, expand your outdoor education and exploration skillsets, and learn hard and soft organizational and administrative skills that will help you succeed in any number of future work environments. Responsibilities will include:

- Training and mentoring Executive Youth Council members in facilitation skills
- Facilitating Youth Council events and meetings; leading topical and informed discussions on mental health, gender identity, bullying, and other social challenges
- Assisting with scheduling, program registrations and other office administrative tasks

Mural (75% time commitment):

The Kanaka Creek Interpretive Art Mural project in Maple Ridge will be a multi-faceted approach to providing educational content surrounding salmon and habitat protection. Working with schools virtually and in-person, this will include a hands-on creation of content for a large-scale public art project that inspires young people, as well as provides them with a sense of tangible contribution to positive messaging about conservation and community engagement. Responsibilities will include:

- Promotion/marketing, registration, and communications with schools and community partners
- Developing slides and other material for the “Art of Empowerment and Visual Story Telling” Community Workshops
- Documenting the project and creating an online presence
- Working with the Earth Foundation artists to design parts of the mural

FAQ:

Why is this called an apprenticeship?

This position is envisioned as a career development opportunity and includes mentorship opportunities. You will work directly with the Executive Director and other community partners. Working alongside a professional artist with 20+ years in commercial, film and mural arts, you will be able to see first-hand what it is like to be a working artist. Learning new skills and developing a portfolio are embedded as outcomes from this position.

What are the qualifications for this position?

The most important qualification for this position is a willingness to be hands-on and make a contribution. An ability to be detail-oriented will be important as this position includes some admin work. Equally important will be the ability to engage people of all ages and all backgrounds in the project and workshops. An interest in visual storytelling and pre-colonial history will also be an asset.

We are particularly interested in receiving applications from participants who face barriers to employment and/or youth at risk in municipal, community and regional environment including those who self-identify as: youth living in rural or remote locations, Indigenous youth, LGBTQ2+ youth, visible minorities (youth), youth with disabilities, youth who are new Canadians, language minorities, etc.

Do I need to be an artist?

While this position would be particularly beneficial to someone who aspires to be a working artist, it is not required that you are an accomplished artist. You should be comfortable demonstrating to participants how to use a paint brush and develop their own artistic ideas.

How much does this pay?

This position pays \$20 per hour.

What are the hours?

The hours will be highly flexible and depend on your availability and stage of the project. Weekend and evening work will be required. Weekly hours are approximately 15 – 20 hours a week.

Is this a remote position?

The administrative portions of this job can be done remotely from your home office. However, it will also require travelling to various schools and to the Mural location in Maple Ridge. 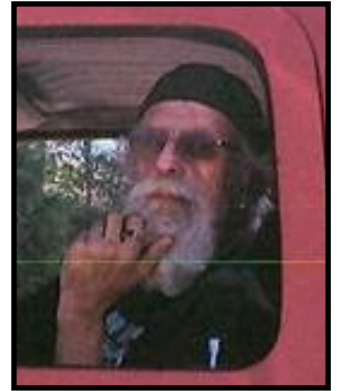

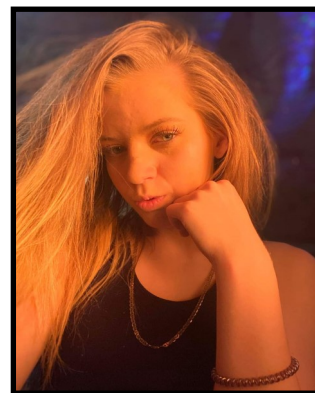

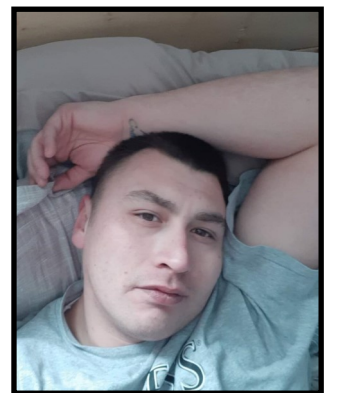
