NOTICE TO OWNERS OF BOATS AT KATZIE 1 WHARF

AND HOMES ALONG RIVER ROAD

Work continues on the new wharf project on Katzie 1, eventually replacing the existing wharf.

While this work is underway, Katzie has been doing critical repairs to the current wharf to keep users as safe as possible. This repair work was unfortunately delayed by the 2022 fishing season, but we are now in a final push to complete it.

The next step is to clear the sediment out from under the wharf so that the floating docks can be 're-floated'. Until this is done, the docks will continue to be destroyed by bottoming out at low tide.

The equipment needed to clear under the floats is very dependent on the tide level, and the best upcoming window for this work is starting the 20th of February, 2023. Work will take about a week.

Although we expect that most of the noise from this work will be reduced by the streambank, we ask for the patience and understanding of members living along River Road at this time.

The equipment that will be used to clean under the floats will require clear access the wharf, so any boats tied at the wharf will need to be moved away by no later than February 20th at 8:30 am. Any boats remaining at the wharf after that point will be temporarily shuffled around by our contractor. If this happens, owners should be clear that the contractor will not be responsible for any damage or losses related to this shuffling. Boats will be moved back where they came from after the work is complete.

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

Copper House Post Design Description

The Township of Langley is requesting original two-dimensional 15" (38.10 cm) w x 57" (144.78 cm) h, black and white formline design submissions from individual Artists and/or Artist teams associated with the ģićəỷ, ġwa:ňÅəň, Máthxwi and Se'mya'me' First Nations. Ideally, the submitted designs should reflect the Artist/Artist team's associated First Nations community (i.e., ģićəỳ, ġwa:ňÅəň, Máthxwi, Se'mya'me') values, identity, and/or stories, sharing connections to the lands and waters, and should include images of Indigenous plants, animals, and/or local landscapes.

The selected designs will be used as base images for the creation of backlit copper house posts, one representing each of the four land-based First Nations, that will be installed in the main exhibition gallery at salishan. The use of copper for these contemporary house posts recognizes the longstanding importance of this metal within Coast Salish lands and its association with health and wealth. Using copper as a medium also connects to the *Idle No More* movement and the breaking of a copper at the BC Legislative Assembly in 2013 and on Parliament Hill in Ottawa in 2014, demonstrating the broken relationships between the federal and provincial governments and Indigenous peoples.

DESIGN SPECIFICATIONS

- Each street light pole can accommodate 2 side by side panels (banners) and will showcase one image split in the middle between the two panels, please take this into consideration when submitting images.
- Final images will be displayed on two banners that are individually 27"w x 72"d which includes a sleeve at the top and bottom, final artwork portion over two banners is 52"w x 51"d. <u>See the diagram here.</u>
- Avoid submitting any images with important elements located directly in the centre of the image.
- Darker colours hold their colour in outdoor settings over time better than lighter, pastel colours.
- Images must be effective for a short viewing duration. Small details and images that are too busy are more difficult to see. Take into account that banners will be viewed from the road at speeds of up to 50 km per hour.

These members will be working over the next several months to review the Nation's current Custom Election Code and develop recommendations to Council as to how the code should be updated. Council will give full and fair consideration to each recommendation. These recommendations will be used to develop updated drafts of each section of the Election Code, which will be shared with the community for additional input / feedback. At the end of the process, the fully updated code will be shared with community members who will vote to accept or reject the updated Election Code in a scheduled referendum.

Katzie Chief and Council would also like to thank all of the members who applied for this committee. The application process was open from June – August 2022, and we received a total of eleven applications. The applications were reviewed by Chief and Council who worked to ensure that the Committee reflected the Katzie Community as closely as possible.

While we were hoping to have a larger committee, some members who applied stated afterwards that they were no longer able to commit to the process due to prior commitments. It was also important to make sure that the Committee was an odd number to reduce the possibility of tied votes. As such, Council decided that a committee of seven members would be the best option.

It is also important to note that all community members will have the opportunity to provide input during the update process. We hope that all community members will collaborate with Council, staff, and the Committee to ensure that the Election Code update process is a success.


