Katzie First Nation Launches Eagle Meadows Business Park Development Project

In April 2023, the Katzie First Nation (KFN) through the EPTA Development Corporation (EDC) will begin developing the Eagle Meadows Business Park (EMBP), located at the northeast corner of Bonson Road and Wharf Street within Katzie First Nation Reserve No 1.

Development of Eagle Meadows Business Park on Katzie Reserve No. 1

Hello Katzie members!

In April 2023, the Katzie First Nation (KFN) through the EPTA Development Corporation (EDC) will begin developing the Eagle Meadows Business Park (EMBP), located at the northeast corner of Bonson Road and Wharf Street within Katzie First Nation Reserve No. 1.

Eagle Meadows Business Park

EMBP is comprised of two light industrial buildings with access from Bonson Road and Wharf Street. When complete, buildings will be setback 17-metres from Bonson Road, including a 7.5-metre-wide layered landscaping buffer to beautify the streetscape and buffer the development from neighbouring residences. A variety of landscaping and engineering solutions will be incorporated to establish amenity areas for the community and businesses, including seating areas and art features designed by a local KFN artist.

The EMBP will provide logistics and operating solutions for local businesses, and generates employment opportunities for KFN, Pitt Meadows, and Maple Ridge residents. The proposed development aligns with the vision and goals, in the Katzie First Nation Land Use Plan which was adopted in 2019, and will provide facilities to help ease the industrial land use shortage in the Metro Vancouver Region.

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Katzie First Nation's Rights and Title

All development on Katzie Reserve No. 1 is under the jurisdiction of the KFN, the sole approving authority. The City of Pitt Meadows recognizes the Katzie First Nation's inherent right to self-determination. Additionally, the City respects the Katzie First Nation's right to enhance their economic success through development of their lands. The City is working collaboratively with the Katzie First Nation to finalize upgrades to the roadway, sanitary, storm and water systems to support future development and KFN's long-term vision.

Secondary Access

Since 2019, the KFN and the City of Pitt Meadows have been advocating to the Province of British Columbia, TransLink, the Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure, and the City of Maple Ridge for a secondary access to KFN lands, creating an additional route to Bonson Road. TransLink has been progressing a secondary access study and a larger Golden Ears Way Corridor Study (GECCS), which includes development of Katzie IR-1 lands and access accommodations. More information and consultation on those items are anticipated in the coming months. The City and KFN will continue these efforts to help build for the long-term future of all communities.

Offsite Upgrades

- Upon conclusion of the development phase, the following infrastructure can be anticipated:
- ✓ Bonson Road from Fraser Way to Bruce Drive will be slightly widened and repaved, including bike lanes;
 - ✓ A new illuminated pedestrian network along the western and southern boundaries of the site, establishing a pedestrian link with tiered landscaping along Bonson Road and Wharf Street;
 - ✓ Upgrades to the sanitary main along Bonson Rd from Fraser Way to Bruce Drive; and
 - ✓ Culverting of the existing ditch along the east side of Bonson Road and a new storm outlet to the Fraser River at the south end of Bonson Road.

What to Expect Next

- Preliminary site preparation works are anticipated to commence in April 2023 and include:
- Additional vehicles and trucks on Bonson Road and Airport Way;
 - Clearing/tree removal on the site;
 - Traffic pattern changes and possible temporary delays;
 - Hauling of soil between 7:00am and 5:00pm Monday to Friday; and
 - Construction noise between 7:00 a.m. and 9:00 p.m. Monday to Saturday.

A construction management plan will be implemented to help reduce impacts to adjacent areas. Trucks staging on Bonson Road will not be permitted and frequent cleaning will be scheduled. The complete build-out is expected by February 2025, pending regional and global supply chain limitations.

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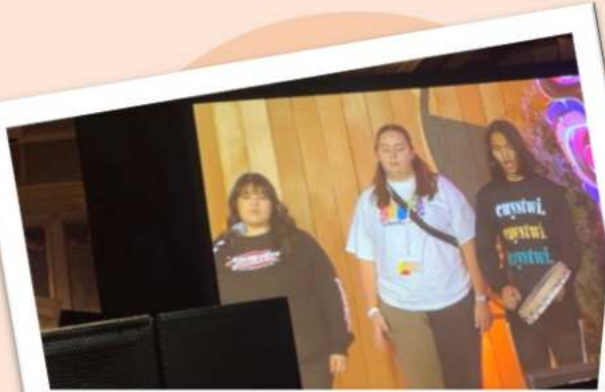

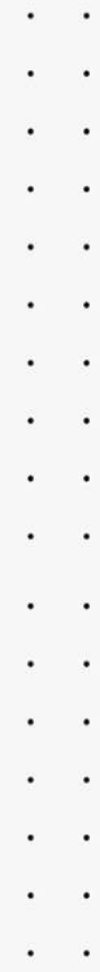

MEET OUR INTERVIEW TEAM!



Alexia Chapman is 21 years old and has lived on Katzie First Nation reserve her entire life. Alexia's parents are Denise Horvath and Vernon Chapman. Her grandparents are Wendy Chapman and Pete Verner. Alexia has worked with KDLP for just over 6 years, mostly doing environmental work, although she has been expanding and doing more archaeological work lately. Alexia loves working outdoors in nature and does that all the time in her free time. She always goes camping and for day trips up to Pitt Lake, as it is to many other members - Pitt Lake is Alexia's home away from home. She always has her big dog Teddy with her - even on the canoe. Alexia is also very creative and loves to paint, draw, and play music.

Tyra Sylvester is a 23-year-old member of Katzie First Nation. Born and raised on the land, growing up living on Katzie IR1 with her mother Laurie Sylvester. Tyra has lineage to Squamish Nation as well, from her father Wade Nahanee. Her maternal grandparents are Arnold Pierre and his late wife Margaret Pierre (Sylvester) from Katzie. Tyra spends most of her time dedicated to raising her daughters Lyric Sylvester and Naia Sylvester. She finds interest in outdoor activities, her culture, and the history of Katzie territories which plays into her love for being an employee of KDLP; while in her spare time she enjoys live music, nature outings and exploring new things like concerts, festivals, food, or places to hike, swim and relax.

ALOUETTE FOODSHED CUMULATIVE IMPACT STUDY



WHAT IS THE ALOUETTE FOODSHED CUMULATIVE IMPACT STUDY?

The study is being led by Katzie's Referrals Department and is focused on understanding Katzie values and priorities in the Alouette River above and below the dam, the Pitt Polder wetlands throughout what is now Maple Ridge and Pitt Meadows, and Katzie slough and connected slough network.

The first goal is to understand the current health of these waters and the plants, fish, wildlife, and Katzie uses they support. The second goal is to understand how the health of these waters can be improved, from a Katzie perspective, and inform Katzie's input on projects and activities in these areas.

BC Hydro is updating their Water Use Plan for the Alouette which defines how Hydro operates water flows through this area. The study will help us understand Katzie's relationship with the Alouette from pre-contact to present day so that we can learn how to honor, protect, and restore this relationship for future generations.

How are we learning about Katzie Values in the Alouette Foodshed?

Perhaps you have stories from the past or can share how you or your family live in relationship with the Alouette or Pitt Polder today, or don't but would like to. We also hope to understand how you would like your nieces, nephews, children, or grandchildren to experience the Alouette Pitt Polder in the future. We humbly ask that Katzie members with experience, interest, or knowledge about the Alouette to help guide our work in the best interests of Katzie.

HOW TO GET INVOLVED:

Our interview team is hosting interviews with Katzie Community members where we can accommodate 1-2 people.

We are scheduling interviews on Mondays and Wednesdays at 9am, 12:30 pm, 3:30pm and 5:30pm each week, and can meet at the Health Center at Katzie 1, Tetoten at Katzie 3, or can even come to your home if you prefer.

We can also accommodate other interview times if needed and can offer a \$100 honorarium in gratitude for your contributions to this work.

Starting in April we will be hosting family dinners, and in May we will be hosting a Family Day at North Beach on Alouette Lake as part of the Katzie Customary Teachings work, **please stay tuned for these details these events and consider joining us!**

We appreciate greatly all information that is shared on the Alouette or other areas of Katzie territory. This information will remain with Katzie to guide our work within the territory for the benefit of future generations.

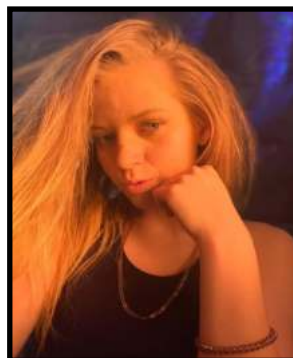
