

Dry Firewood available for Katzie Households

UBC Research Forest has put aside blocks of firewood for homes with woodstoves.

Last year we had Katzie people looking for dry firewood in the cold of winter when dry wood is hard to come by. This year we would like to be proactive by providing people with the opportunity to prepare for winter months ahead of time. The blocks that we have arranged are dry.

We are hoping to have two types of fire wood delivery programs:

- Option 1 Elders and Accessbility Roma will arrange for cut wood to be
 delivered by the KFN Public Works Maintenance crew to the homes of Elders
 and/or members with barriers that have contacted us.
- Option 2 For all others Roma will arrange with the KFN Public Works
 Maintenance crew for blocks of wood to be available for pick-up by Katzie
 members on IR1, and members will be responsible for transporting the wood
 to their homes. Katzie is also not able to provide cutting for this wood.

Please note that we have a limited amount and this may be the only opportunity for dry firewood this year. We want to encourage Elders and/or members with barriers that will be needing firewood this winter to let us know so that we can make the necessary arrangements.

Why Unauthorized RV Living is Not Permitted on KFN Lands

It's a matter of health and safety

The Katzie First Nation Subdivision, Development & Servicing Law prohibits unauthorized RV living on KFN Lands.



- Recreational Vehicles (RVs) pose a significant fire risk, primarily due to electrical short circuits.
- A recreational vehicle (RV) can burn to the ground within 10 minutes, posing a significant fire hazard. Individuals inside an RV during a fire may be overcome by toxic fumes, hindering their ability to escape. An RV fire can then rapidly spread to any nearby buildings.
- Improper management of RV septic tank sewage can lead to serious health risks for humans & pets. Harmful bacteria & parasite can cause E. coli, shigellosis, typhoid, salmonella, cholera, round worm, skin infections and lung infections.
- Unattached RV vehicles and units such as travel trailers, fifth wheels, boat trailers, utility trailers, campers are considered unauthorized RVs and are not permitted to be parked along Katzie Roads for safety reasons.

Unauthorized RVs are prohibited by Katzie Laws and are a punishable offense under Schedule 2 of KFN Enforcement Ticketing Law with fines up to \$300 for each violation.

WHAT IS PROVINCAL ELECTIONS

The Provincal or Territoral government hold the authority to make decisions which effect the entire province or territory but not for the rest of Canada. We have provincal elections so that the elected leader can make changes for our province as a whole. This entailes things such as health, transportation, labour, child welfare, education, property and civil rights.

WHY IS IT IMPORTANT TO VOTE

Every election affects each person whether its Provincial or Federal. Its important to vote because the person elected is making decisions that effects us all. Many people seem to think that their vote won't matter but with the more people that start to vote, it could create a different outcome. Change comes from the people and if you feel you want change within our province I would suggest registering to vote.

INCLUDING INDIGENOUS COMMUNITYS

Indigenous people have experienced exclussion for many years, In 1995 Elections BC was established and they would like to have meaningful engagement within the indigenous community and help with any barriers that prevent people from voting. They also would like to share information about voter registration, voting opportunitys, as well as job opportunities.
