


Katzie Wharf Project Information session

Join the Infrastructure Team on November 13th at 5:30 PM for a community engagement session to learn about the upcoming Wharf Construction project. We'll discuss the construction timeline (starting January 2025, ending March 2025), address boat storage and accessibility needs during the project, and gather information on derelict boats in the marina. We'll also cover pile installation details and plans to monitor nearby homes for any impact. A follow-up session will be held in January to review any updates, with further information available in newsletters and at the marina.

Remembrance Day!

Remembrance Day, observed on November 11th, is a solemn occasion to honor and remember the sacrifices made by military personnel who served and died in conflicts, particularly during World War I and World War II. The day serves as a time of reflection on the courage and dedication of those who gave their lives for their country.

Traditionally, a moment of silence is observed at 11:00 AM to mark the armistice signed on November 11, 1918, which ended the First World War. The red poppy, a symbol of remembrance, is worn to recognize the fallen and to support veterans and their families.

Remembrance Day not only commemorates the past but also reinforces the importance of peace and the impact of war on future generations. It is a reminder to cherish freedom and to never forget the sacrifices that secured it.

Economic Development Update

Langley Development Site: Rezoning Application In Review

The Katzie, Kwantlen and Semiahmoo (KKS) Nations are advancing the development of 4.5 acres within the shared territories to provide benefits to the communities. This project, just off 200 Street and 86 Avenue (Lot 27 – 86 Avenue, Langley, BC), will support high-density housing. Sacred Waters Developments is leading development on behalf of the KKS Nations.

Project Specifics

Early visioning for the project indicated the importance of greenspace, gathering spaces and creating homes suitable for families, including flexible unit types. Since our last update, there have been changes to the project. The proposal now includes:

- 4 towers creating 1,688 homes (up from 1,466 in last proposal) including a mix of studio to 3-bedroom units
- Inclusion of 2 bedrooms with 1 bedroom lock-off unit to address flexibility and family circumstance
- Market and below-market rental housing to support a range of needs
- Ground floor retail and space for service areas including healthcare; the current proposal has added potential for a grocery store and more retail at ground level of towers 1 and 2
- Greenspace corridor throughout the site
- Useable rooftop space that includes community gardens and gathering spaces
- Exploring both rental and home ownership models to provide ongoing economic security for the KKS Nations



About Sacred Waters Developments

In 2022, the KKS Nations established Sacred Waters Developments, a joint economic development company, to build the Nations' capacity to both benefit from and create more economic and social growth opportunities within their shared territory. Our vision is to foster long-term security and prosperity for future generations while advancing cultural awareness and land preservation. We aim to help improve the quality of life for community members and provide more shared opportunities that enhance holistic, seven generation growth.

Latest News

Sacred Waters has received comments from the Township of Langley on their rezoning application and is working closely with the architects to revise the project accordingly.

As part of the revisions, we are exploring shifting the tower podiums in an east-west orientation. This new alignment will allow the project to retain more natural light while offering better views, increase tower separation and provide more public space between the towers. Additionally, the updated design may include more opportunities for retail and/or a grocery store at ground level.

Next Steps

Sacred Waters is currently working on adjusting the design based on feedback from the Township. Once these revisions are made, we will resubmit the rezoning package.

We are early in the development process. Sacred Waters will continue to provide updates as the project moves forward. We are planning engagement for this project and are offering opportunities for KKS community members to learn more about the project, ask questions and contribute ideas. An invitation to participate in this engagement will be sent out shortly.

What is the Katzie Land Code, and how does it benefit Katzie First Nation?

Approved in 2017, the Katzie Land Code replaces 44 sections of the *Indian Act*. The Katzie Land Code enables KFN to resume authority to govern their lands and create laws. Since 2017, Katzie has developed and implemented Katzie Laws to mitigate negative impacts due to past poor management of Katzie Lands under the *Indian Act*.

Why are we encouraging discussion about the Land Code?

Katzie's Chief and Council hope to share information and seek member input regarding the purpose of the Katzie Land Code and Laws to encourage meaningful discussion on what members believe is working well and what is not and to discuss possible solutions.

(January 10 through April 10, 2025)

English 394J: Interdisciplinary Studies in English Literature

Cultural Studies 499: Community-Engaged Research in Cultural Studies



Students learn the Salish community's land-based stories as they relate to the nation's land/Land/tmixw/teməxw and as they relate to ecosystem restoration projects. Students gain an opportunity to transform their consciousnesses and communication skills through experiential learning and through new ways of reading/listening to Salish Elders, Knowledge Keepers, Protectors and Scholars. Students learn through on-line



classes and through two 4-day on the Land internships in two local Salishan communities: one Interior Salish (accommodation tba) and one Coast Salish (accommodation at Loon Lake Lodge in Katzie Territory). Travel and accommodation will be covered through an Indigenous Strategic Initiatives (ISI) Stream 1 Innovation grant.

Pre-requisites: 3 or 4-year standing and previous experience in Indigenous Studies, language and/or literatures, and/or Indigenous community land-based work.

Application to this unique course is through email application to me (kerrie.charnley@ubc.ca) stating your background education and experience regarding the above pre-requisites, and an interview. The course will be filled based on the application, the interview and is on a first come first serve basis. Limit is 12 students.

* Three seats are saved for community members of the two Salish nations where the course is.
