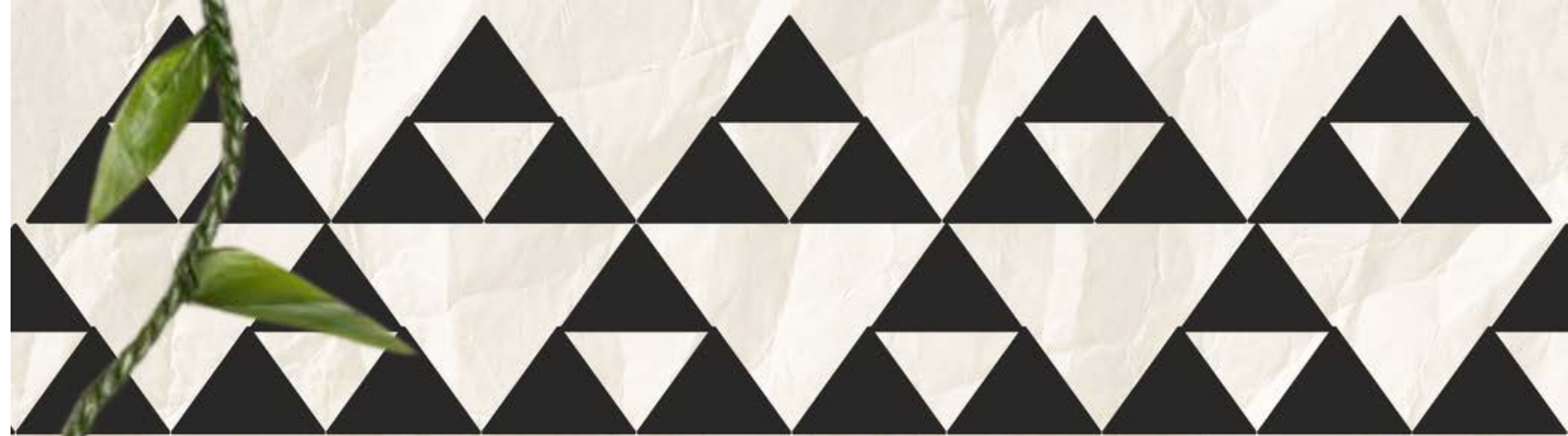

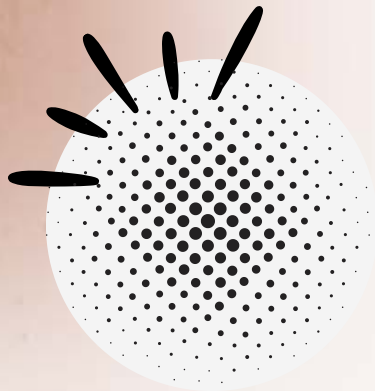


Access for Katzie Members at Golden Ears Park

PROJECT UPDATE- UPCOMING CONSTRUCTION

Hello,

Preliminary construction-related activities are currently underway for the Eagle Meadows Business Park. To prepare the current ground conditions for the construction of two industrial buildings, we will be commencing site preparation activities including Rapid Impact Compaction (RIC) works, which includes an excavator mounted hydraulic hammer.

What to expect

Timing

- This work is scheduled to begin on Monday, June 08, 2026, and will continue until mid to late August 2026.

Hours of work

- Monday to Friday from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Location

- The Eagle Meadows Business Park is located at 19755 and 19757 Wharf Street in Pitt Meadows (see map below).

Traffic

- There are no anticipated traffic impacts related to this work.
- Road users are advised to use caution and follow direction from traffic control personnel when travelling in the project area.

Impacts

- While this work is taking place, a temporary increase of noise can be expected.
- As required, the contractor will implement mitigation measures to help address these concerns.
- Noise monitoring will be in place during this work including vibration sensors at various locations surrounding the work area.

North Lougheed Area Plan Update

Since 2024, Katzie has been working with the City of Pitt Meadows on the North Lougheed Area Plan. This week, Pitt Meadows shared a high-level version of the Plan as part of its public consultation. Katzie helped shape this version of the Plan, and we will keep working with Pitt Meadows over the summer before the Plan is finalized in the fall.

As part of this work, we hosted an Elders lunch, a community open house and dinner, and interviews with Katzie people who have knowledge of or experience with the site. These conversations and interviews helped guide our work with Pitt Meadows.

This site includes higher ground along the highway and lower land behind it. The higher ground is an important place for Katzie — a place where our people once lived and where at least one, and possibly more, of our Ancestors are buried. Old photos also show that the lower land once had several channels connected to Katzie Slough.

Pitt Meadows has been planning development for this site in stages since the 1980s. In 2020, the City was close to approving an overall development plan without consulting Katzie. Katzie leadership stepped in, and the plan was paused so proper consultation could take place.

In 2008, one of our Ancestors at this site was disturbed during archaeological work. Katzie people came to care for the Ancestor and lay them back to rest. At that time, our community made it clear that this site should not be disturbed again. Through our work with Pitt Meadows, we have continued to honour that message by bringing forward measures in the Plan to protect Katzie Ancestors, honour Katzie culture, and create space for future collaboration, including:

- **Katzie leadership in planning and development** – Ongoing collaboration helps ensure Katzie has a meaningful role in shaping how the area grows.
- **Protection of Ancestors and cultural sites** – Stronger measures help protect burial sites and other culturally significant places.
- **Heritage Conservation Area designation** – New planning tools help safeguard Katzie heritage across the area and support Katzie Guardians in monitoring and protecting it.
- **Space for cultural recognition and honouring** – Parks and public spaces can support Katzie cultural use and ceremony, reflect Katzie place names, and recognize Katzie culture in their design.
- **Restoration of land and waters** – The Plan calls for rewatering wetlands and historic sloughs where possible, supporting Katzie stewardship of land and water.
- **Economic opportunities and planning** – Pitt Meadows has committed to working with Katzie on economic planning and future implementation.

This week, as part of Pitt Meadows' public consultation, Chief Grace shared the following statement:

"As ᑭᓴᓴᓴ (Katzie) people, our connection to this land is not only historical, it is living, ongoing and rooted in our responsibilities as stewards. Any development within our traditional and unceded territory must honour our rights, protect our cultural sites, and uphold the health of the land and waterways. We acknowledge the collaboration to date and will continue to advocate for planning that reflects our laws, values and the well-being of future generations."

Over the summer, we hope to bring forward a Katzie place name for the Plan area and continue to work with the City to finalize the Plan for adoption in the fall. Because the Plan will guide future development in this area, we will continue working with the City and landowners to ensure Katzie values and responsibilities are upheld.

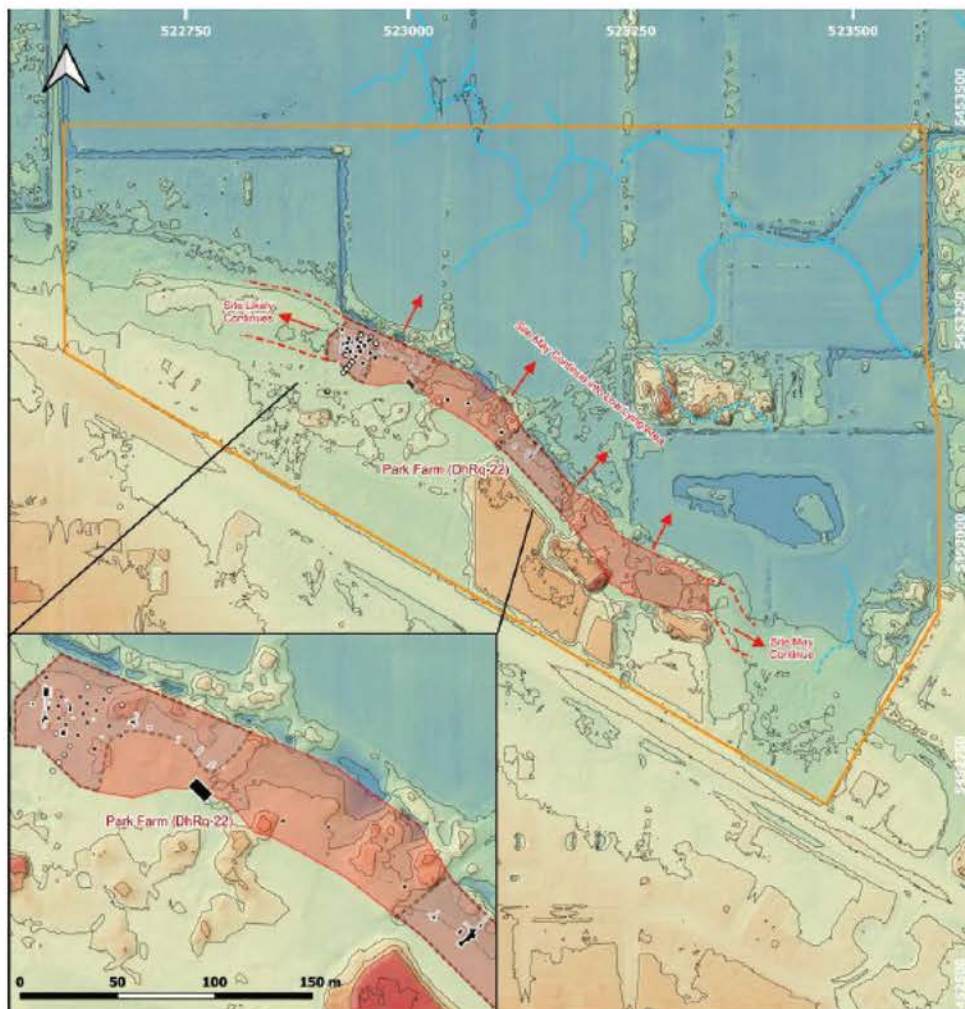
City of Pitt Meadows North Lougheed Area Plan



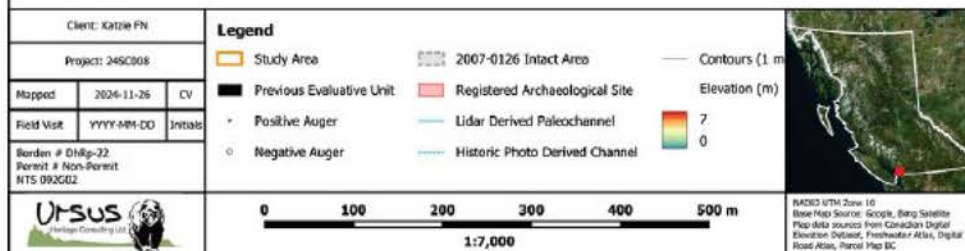
