North Lougheed Area Plan Update

Since 2024, Katzie has been working with the City of Pitt Meadows on the North Lougheed Area Plan. This week, Pitt Meadows shared a high-level version of the Plan as part of its public consultation. Katzie helped shape this version of the Plan, and we will keep working with Pitt Meadows over the summer before the Plan is finalized in the fall.

As part of this work, we hosted an Elders lunch, a community open house and dinner, and interviews with Katzie people who have knowledge of or experience with the site. These conversations and interviews helped guide our work with Pitt Meadows.

This site includes higher ground along the highway and lower land behind it. The higher ground is an important place for Katzie — a place where our people once lived and where at least one, and possibly more, of our Ancestors are buried. Old photos also show that the lower land once had several channels connected to Katzie Slough.

Pitt Meadows has been planning development for this site in stages since the 1980s. In 2020, the City was close to approving an overall development plan without consulting Katzie. Katzie leadership stepped in, and the plan was paused so proper consultation could take place.

In 2008, one of our Ancestors at this site was disturbed during archaeological work. Katzie people came to care for the Ancestor and lay them back to rest. At that time, our community made it clear that this site should not be disturbed again. Through our work with Pitt Meadows, we have continued to honour that message by bringing forward measures in the Plan to protect Katzie Ancestors, honour Katzie culture, and create space for future collaboration, including:

- **Katzie leadership in planning and development** – Ongoing collaboration helps ensure Katzie has a meaningful role in shaping how the area grows.
- **Protection of Ancestors and cultural sites** – Stronger measures help protect burial sites and other culturally significant places.
- **Heritage Conservation Area designation** – New planning tools help safeguard Katzie heritage across the area and support Katzie Guardians in monitoring and protecting it.
- **Space for cultural recognition and honouring** – Parks and public spaces can support Katzie cultural use and ceremony, reflect Katzie place names, and recognize Katzie culture in their design.
- **Restoration of land and waters** – The Plan calls for rewatering wetlands and historic sloughs where possible, supporting Katzie stewardship of land and water.
- **Economic opportunities and planning** – Pitt Meadows has committed to working with Katzie on economic planning and future implementation.

This week, as part of Pitt Meadows' public consultation, Chief Grace shared the following statement:

"As ǵícəy (Katzie) people, our connection to this land is not only historical, it is living, ongoing and rooted in our responsibilities as stewards. Any development within our traditional and unceded territory must honour our rights, protect our cultural sites, and uphold the health of the land and waterways. We acknowledge the collaboration to date and will continue to advocate for planning that reflects our laws, values and the well-being of future generations."

Over the summer, we hope to bring forward a Katzie place name for the Plan area and continue to work with the City to finalize the Plan for adoption in the fall. Because the Plan will guide future development in this area, we will continue working with the City and landowners to ensure Katzie values and responsibilities are upheld.

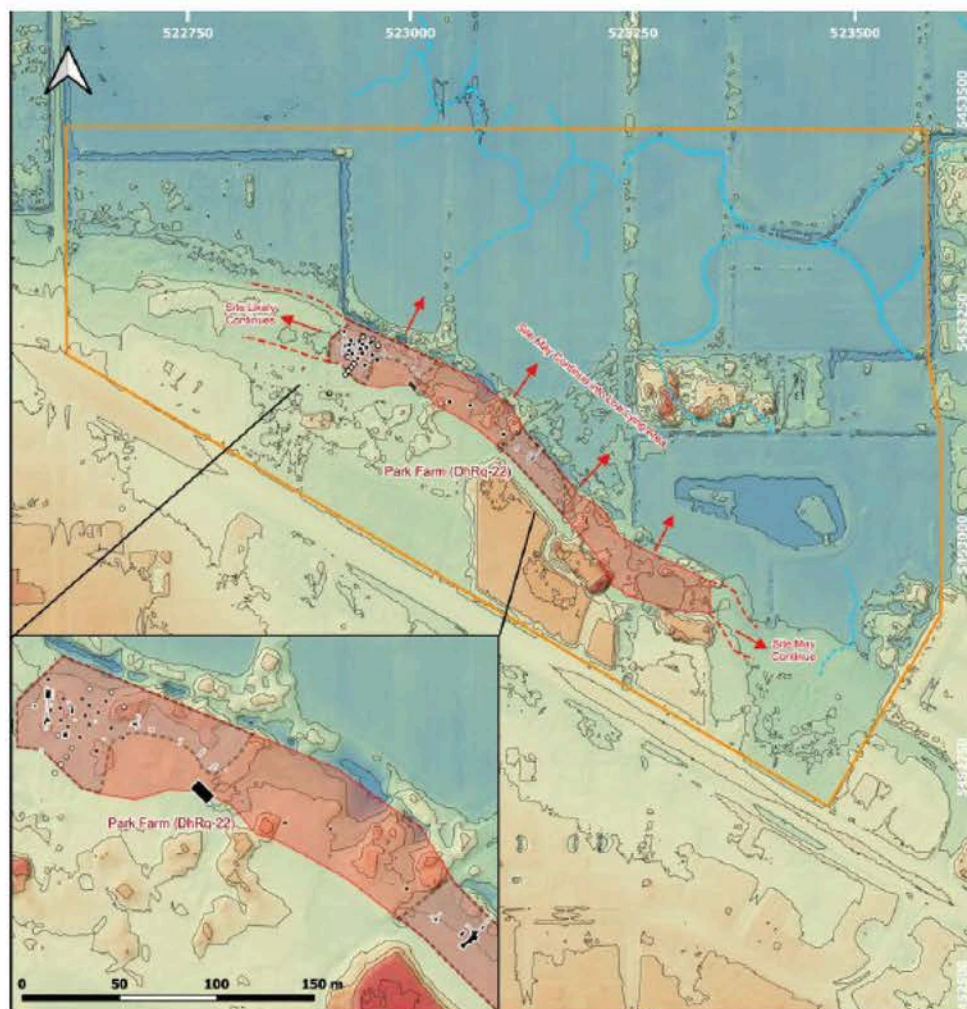
City of Pitt Meadows North Lougheed Area Plan



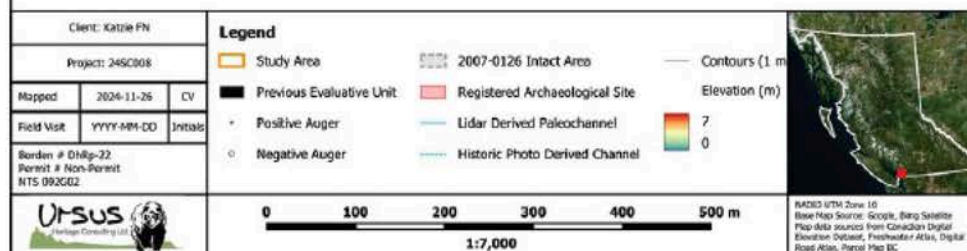

- All dogs must be confined within the boundaries of the owner’s property.
- When on public property, dogs must be kept on a leash no longer than 2 meters.



Noise and Barking Control

Dogs may bark when bored, lonely, or to alert their owners.

Please ensure your dog is a good neighbor.

Persistent barking can be addressed through:

- Training
- Socialization
- Regular exercise
- Positive interaction with family members

Statement to the Katzie Community

Clarifying Details on the Musqueam Indian Band's Rights Recognition Agreement

To the Katzie Community,

On February 20, 2026, the Government of Canada announced it had signed a series of agreements with the Musqueam Indian Band recognizing rights, stewardship and fisheries. The federal government describes the Musqueam agreements as a “major step forward towards reconciliation and incremental implementation of Musqueam’s Aboriginal rights as affirmed under Section 35 of the Constitution Act, 1982.”

The agreements include:

- šxwq̓'altələn A Rights Recognition Agreement – Recognizes that Musqueam has Aboriginal rights including title within their traditional territory and establishes a framework for incremental implementation of rights and nation-to-nation relations with Canada.
- xʷməθkʷəy̓əm Stewardship & Marine Management Agreement – Establishes bilateral collaborative working groups so that Musqueam knowledge and stewardship practices will guide shared decision-making in this incremental implementation agreement to protect and manage the waters and resources within Musqueam territory.
- xʷməθkʷəy̓əm Fisheries Agreement – Supports Musqueam’s and Canada’s shared decision-making role in collaborative fisheries management within Musqueam territory, and provides implementation funding as well as funding for access, vessels and gear through this incremental implementation agreement.

Katzie was not consulted or meaningfully engaged by the federal government prior to the announcement of these agreements. As such, Katzie leadership requested a meeting with federal officials to obtain full transparency on the agreements, including their scope, intent, and any implications for our territory and interests. This meeting occurred on March 25, 2026, where Canada’s representatives provided the following clarification.

The Rights Recognition Agreement is an aspirational document that recognizes Musqueam’s Aboriginal rights including title within their traditional territory but does not define what these rights are or their scope. Canada and Musqueam are simply agreeing to continue engaging on a nation-to-nation basis to determine how Musqueam’s rights and title can be implemented gradually



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over time. If future discussions do lead to infringements on other First Nation's rights and title, those Nations would need to be fully consulted by Canada. This is precisely what Katzie is doing through its incremental self-government process.

In regard to the Stewardship & Marine Management Agreement and the Fisheries Agreement, Canada clarified that these agreements do not change current ministerial authority, nor do they provide Musqueam with exclusive fisheries or additional fisheries licenses. These agreements simply provide Musqueam and Canada with a forum to discuss marine management and fisheries issues in the future. They also contemplate the need for other levels of government and First Nations to participate in these discussions, if necessary. Currently, Canada and Musqueam have not started negotiations on these topics, Musqueam is still under the Aboriginal Fisheries Strategy, and if future discussions do impact the rights and title of other First Nations, Canada will consult and accommodate these Nations, as necessary.

Based on this information, the Musqueam agreements don't recognize specific Musqueam rights which would infringe Katzie rights. Katzie will continue to defend and uphold our inherent Aboriginal rights and title and will continue to maintain a positive relationship with our relatives at the Musqueam Indian Band. However, Katzie will challenge any process or agreement that undermines or disregards our rights, title, or jurisdiction over our territory.

Keep it steady and hold your phone a few inches away.



Make sure the QR code is clear and not blurry.



If nothing pops up, move your phone a little closer or farther away.
